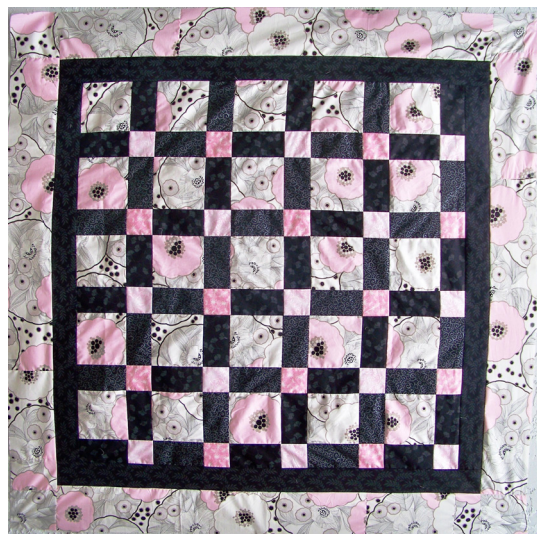
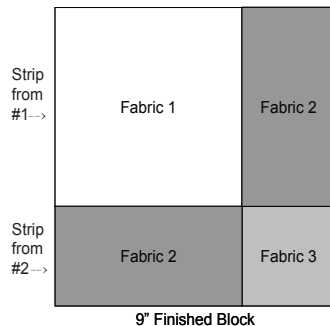


Touch of Color Quilt

This quilt is an excellent way to combine beautiful fabrics using an easily pieced block. Use just a touch of your favorite color to personalize it. The finished quilt as shown here is approximately 63" x 63"

Supplies

- ① 1 yd. of Fabric 1 (largest square in block)
- ② 1 1/8 yds. of Fabric 2 (two rectangular accents in block)
- ③ 1/3 yd. Fabric 3 (smallest square in block)
- ④ 1/2 yd. Inner Border fabric, 1 1/8 yds. Outer Border fabric, 1/2 yd. Binding fabric, 3 1/2 yds. Backing fabric



Instructions

1. Cut five 6 1/2" strips from Fabric 1. Cut five 3 1/2" strips from Fabric 2. Sew Fabrics 1 & 2 together lengthwise into strip sets. Press seam toward the Fabric 2. Cut twenty five (25) 6 1/2" strips from the strip sets.
2. Cut three 6 1/2" strips from Fabric 2. Cut three 3 1/2" strips from Fabric 3. Sew Fabrics 2 & 3 together lengthwise into strip sets. Press seam toward the Fabric 2. Cut twenty five (25) 3 1/2" strips from the strip sets.
3. Sew the strips from #1 and #2 together to make the block. Make a total of 25 blocks.
4. Arrange the blocks in a 5 x 5 layout or as you prefer. You can lay out all of the blocks in one direction (as in the pictured quilt) or turn the blocks in different directions to get an entirely different look.
5. Sew the blocks into rows. Sew the rows together. Be sure to press seams carefully.
6. Cut five 3 1/2" strips of Inner Border fabric. Apply inner borders.
7. Cut six 6 1/2" strips of Outer Border fabric. Apply outer borders.
8. Quilt as desired.
9. Cut seven 2 1/2" strips of Binding fabric. Bind as preferred.
